








Performance of selected groups at KS4 % achieving 5 A*-C GCSE including Eng & Maths

Average point score per student










- Croydon performance in previous years was better than national and statistical neighbours
- A new assessment methodology was used in summer 2013, which assesses 'a Good Level of Development
- 46% of Croydon children reached a GLD (c.f. national 52%, and statistical neighbor average of 52%)
- Outcomes may be due to overcautious teacher assessment using the new methodology




Key Stage 1 (age 7)



Attainment at Key Stage 2 (age 11)




Performance of selected groups at KS2 (% achieving level 4+ in Mathematics, reading & writing)


Borough performance in persistent absence trends



Exclusions

 Primary: <u>no</u> permanent exclusions from primary schools, due to the Fair Access panel

 Secondary: 65 permanent exclusions, an increase of 1 from the previous year. Has improved this education year now have a secondary Fair Access Panel





OfSTED Inspection Profile: % of schools judged good or better by OFSTED




Very positive improvement trend:

- September 2012 67%
- End of July 2013 73%.
- A further 15 inspections have taken place during the autumn term 2013, taking the percentage of Croydon schools judged good or better to <u>78%</u>.

Executive Summary

- Standards of Attainment in Croydon's schools and settings continue to rise.
- At Key Stage 4, GCSE results were notably better than statistical neighbour and national averages and similar to London averages.
- At age 19 Croydon learners performed above the national average on Average Point Score.
- Croydon performance at the end of Key Stage 1 was better than statistical neighbours and national in reading, writing and maths, better than London in mathematics and equal to London in reading and writing.
- At Key Stage 2 Croydon results were above statistical neighbour and national averages in reading at Level 4 and mathematics at Level 5
- School attendance has improved further.
- There were no permanent exclusions from primary schools.
