RESOLVED to

- 1. Approve the award of the framework for Internal Audit & Anti-Fraud ("the Services") to the successful Contractor upon the terms detailed in the associated Part B report, for a maximum contract term of eight years (initial term of six years to extend for further periods not exceeding two years)
- 2. Note that the maximum value of the framework for use by the public sector bodies detailed in the report is £50m over the maximum contract term.
- 3. Agree the annual contract value to Croydon of an estimated £396k, with a total estimated contract spend of £3.168m over the maximum eight year term of the contract, to be instructed through the placement of Service Orders against the framework.
- 4. Note that the name of the successful Contractor will be published upon conclusion of the standstill period required under regulation 87 of the Public Contract Regulations 2015.
