The premises licence holder will ensure:

- 1. The restaurant operates as drive-thru only during the licensable period.
- 2. A digital motion activated closed circuit television (CCTV) system where images are retained on a hard drive, operates at the premises with appropriate signage displayed.
- 3. The CCTV equipment is of a standard suitable to record images of a proper quality, it meets the industry standard and has LGC Forensics Certification. As part of the digital system an alarm will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene.
- 4. Regular servicing of the CCTV system by qualified maintenance technicians.
- 5. Access to the CCTV system will be provided to Police Officers upon request.
- 6. A Staffsafe system with both audio and visual monitoring capability will be installed in the restaurant activated by either fixed or mobile panic buttons. Once activated, the system links the restaurant to an external monitoring centre capable of intervening to resolve crime and disorder issues and/or provide the appropriate advice or instruction to support and protect the staff and customers of the restaurant.
- 7. All shift managers to have safety and security training including Maybo SIA accredited conflict management training.
- 8. The premises operates a "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the premises.
- 9. Customers are encouraged to be considerate to neighbours and to limit noise both when ordering food and on leaving the local area.
- Children are protected from harm at all times when visiting the premises.

Operating Schedule

<u>General</u>

This restaurant understands that in extending our opening hours we have a duty to the local community and that we continue to protect our staff and customers from danger and harm. We believe that the systems we have in place are robust, thorough and will, as far as reasonably practicable, secure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. It should be noted that no McDonald's restaurant within the United Kingdom serves alcohol and further none of our drinks or food are served to customers in glass receptacles.

We are eager to work in partnership with all responsible authorities to ensure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. We also seek to work with the local communities, whom we serve, in achieving a successful cohesion between our business operations and our neighbours.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local police service to prevent crime and disorder.

CCTV

McDonald's operates a robust CCTV Policy to ensure compliance with Data Protection Legislation and to assist the Police with the prevention and detection of crime. At all stores where CCTV is in operation appropriate signage reflecting this information is displayed.

McDonald's operate digital motion activated CCTV systems where images are retained on a hard drive system. All CCTV equipment is of a standard suitable to record images of a proper quality, it meets the industry standard and has LGC Forensics or Kalagate Certification. As part of the digital system an alarm will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene. The CCTV system is regularly serviced by qualified maintenance technicians.

Access to the CCTV system will be provided to Police Officers at their request.

Staffsafe

A StaffsafeTM system with both audio and visual monitoring capability will be installed in the restaurant, this system, can be activated by either fixed or mobile panic buttons. Once activated the system links the restaurant to an external monitoring centre capable of intervening to resolve crime and disorder issues and/or provide the appropriate advice or instruction to support and protect the restaurant's staff and customers.

At this restaurant all shift managers have safety and security training; including Maybo SIA accredited Conflict Management Training.

Public Safety

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local Fire Service and Environmental Health Officer to ensure public safety.

This restaurant has safety systems in place to protect the safety of customers and staff at all times (such as Staffsafe). We work with the local Environmental Health Office and local Fire Service to ensure we are complying, as far as reasonably practicable, with relevant Health and Safety and Fire Safety Legislation. This restaurant is also subject to inspections from our own safety and security teams to ensure our systems are being maintained.

All of our restaurant staff receive comprehensive safety training to ensure that safe working methods are adopted and all staff are trained on the restaurant's evacuation procedure in the event of a fire or other dangerous occurrence.

This store operates a "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the in-store area.

Public Nuisance

Litter

McDonald's were the first company in our sector to introduce litter patrols in the early 1980's. McDonald's is committed to carry out litter patrols collecting both McDonald's packaging and any other litter that has been carelessly discarded. We are happy to act on recommendations from the Environmental Health Officer should they feel that we should extend our patrol to a nearby area, as far as this is reasonably practicable.

All of McDonald's packaging displays the "Bin It" symbol to encourage our customers to deal with their waste responsibly. Noise

Where it is practical to do so we are content to put measures in place to limit noise. All McDonald's restaurant doors are self-closing and we try to encourage our customers to be considerate to our neighbours and to limit noise both when ordering their food and on leaving the local area.

The Protection of Children from Harm

McDonald's do not anticipate that unaccompanied children will use the restaurant in the extended hour's period covered by this licensing application. We do however take their safety extremely seriously and will continue to employ the same practices to ensure that they are protected from harm at all times when visiting the restaurant.

The premises licence holder shall (ensure) -

- 1. Managers shall be given training in relation to conflict management and the protection of children from harm (including Child Sexual Exploitation training). Refresher training will be undertaken every 12 months and records shall be kept on company records, made available for inspection by the police or authorised officials from the local authority as required.
- 2. Ensure that a comprehensive incident register is maintained, at the premises. The following details shall be recorded:
- a) Date
- b) Time
- c) Location
- d) Persons concerned
- e) Summary of incident
- f) Identification of any Emergency Services Personnel who attended
- 3. Security Industry Authority (SIA) Door Supervisors, will be deployed at the restaurant on a risk assessed based undertaken by the local senior management team as and when required, or in consultation with the local police.

Dear Sirs

I wish to object to the application by the above to extend their opening hours as per their application dated 23 October 2019.

Objections are the same as per their planning application 19/03983/CONR, viz: smells, noise and light.

Confirming my own observations I receive complaints from neighbours concerning these subjects. The smells go far beyond Grove Road. I have also received a complaint about the car park recently being used as a race track. I was away when this occurred.

London Road has been listed as one of the most polluted roads in Croydon. McDonald's does not help. I seem to remember that in the original plans for McDonald's before it was built there were to be trees planted against their boundary with Grove Road. What happened?

I confirm that the related objectives are Prevention of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder.

Dear licensing team,

I am writing to object to the application for a 24/7 licence for this restaurant.

A number of local residents have contacted me in my capacity as one of their local ward councillors and raised the following concerns, which I wish to convey:

- concerns about anti social behaviour associated with poor and inconsiderate driving
 by those visiting the restaurant both as drive-thru customers and those eating at the
 restaurant. The complaints include the suggestion that vehicles have been using the
 mostly empty car park in the evenings as an informal racing track. Extending the
 hours of operation to 24/7 will clearly exacerbate this problem and situation.
- I have received concerns and complaints about ASB associated with patrons arriving at and leaving the restaurant in a noisy and disturbing manner. Again, this will be exacerbated by 24/7 opening hours.

Please take these objections - and those of residents - into account when considering this application, which I believe should be refused.


