| Why are you doing this? | Under Section 48(3) of the Local Government Act 1985 and Regulation 6(8) of the Levying Bodies (General) Regulations 1992, member authorities are required to contribute financially to the LCGS in proportion to their respective populations. Each member authority is required to consider a budget proposed by the Leaders Committee of London Councils annually for the forthcoming year. A ² / ₃ majority of the member councils are required to approve the budget by 1 February each year. | | | | | |
| What is likely to be different when you have finished? | At £290,085, the Council's contribution to the London Councils Grants Scheme for 2018/19 will decrease by £38,186 compared with its contribution in 2017/18, as was recommended by the London Councils Leaders Committee. The financial year 2018/19 represents to second year of the four-year programme of commissions provided by the Grants Committee under S.48 of the Local Government Act 1985, as recommended by the Grants Committee and approved by the Leaders' Committee in March 2016. London Councils conducted an equalities impact assessment of this decision in 2016. Priority 1 and 2 projects to tackle homelessness and domestic and sexual violence were commissioned in February 2017 and will deliver services between April 2017 and March 2021. There will be no reduction in services as a result of this decision. Priority 3 projects to tackle poverty through employment were commissioned in 2016 and will deliver services between 2016 and 2018. Priority 3 projects are matchfunded by the European Social Fund (ESF). | | | | | |

| | Council contributions for 2018/19 have been reduced, but this is solely due to the fact that all payments due from boroughs to match-fund the ESF contribution for Priority 3 projects have been paid in 2017/18. The overall resources available for projects delivered 2018/19 will remain the same as for 2017/18. | | | | |
