BRIEF FOR THE COMMITTEE:	 Recommendations; Members of the Children and Young People's Scrutiny (sub-committee) are asked to recommend to the main Scrutiny Committee that scrutiny over the Children's Improvement Plan be devolved to the Children and Young People's sub-committee following annual council in May 2018. 	

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report outlines the proposed role of Children and Young People's Scrutiny Committee in scrutinising progress against the Children's Improvement Plan (see plan here) following annual council in May 2018.
- 1.2 Members are asked to review and approve the proposal set out in section 3 of this report and make a recommendation to the main Scrutiny Committee that scrutiny over the Children's Improvement Plan be devolved to the Children and Young People's sub-committee following annual council in May 2018.

1.3 It should be noted that the Children's Improvement Plan was approved at Cabinet on the 20th November 2017, and progress against the plan is currently reported to Scrutiny and Overview Committee and the Children's Improvement Board on a monthly basis.

2. Current reporting arrangements around Children's Improvement

2.1 The table below (figure 1) describes the current reporting arrangements around Children's Improvement activity to Cabinet, Scrutiny and Overview Committee and the Children and Young People's Scrutiny Committee.

2.2 In addition to the committees set out above, the independently chaired Children's Improvement Board, which includes in its membership the Children, Young People and Learning Cabinet Member, Finance & Treasury Cabinet Member and the Shadow Cabinet Member, Children, Young People and Learning, is responsible for providing oversight and challenge around progress in delivering the Children's Improvement plan and receives an update report on progress from the Executive Director, People (DCS) every month.

3. Proposal for the role of Children and Young People's Scrutiny Committee in monitoring children's improvement

3.1 It is proposed that, going forward, Children and Young People's Scrutiny will be the committee that leads on scrutiny of progress against the Children's Improvement Plan and will be responsible for holding responsible officers and cabinet members to account.


3.2 The committee will receive update reports on progress against the plan, including;

- Progress overview to date
- Key achievements
- Key challenges and mitigations
- Key performance indicators (KPI's)

3.3 This is depicted in figure 2 below. It is proposed that the main Scrutiny and Overview committee receive a high-level summary of progress against which the Chair of Children and Young People's Scrutiny Committee can speak.

3.4 The rationale behind this proposal is that Children and Young People's Scrutiny is better placed than Scrutiny and Overview Committee to dedicate sufficient time and focus to delivering in depth scrutiny of and robust challenge around progress across the Children's Improvement Plan going forward.
